IT TAKES TWO: HANGMAN

Classic Hangman

This is a game of mystery words.

To play:

- 1. Find a partner to play with you. One of you will think up the word (the drawer) and the other will try to guess it (the guesser).
- 2. The drawer thinks up a word and tells the guesser how many letters it has.
- 3. The guesser guesses one letter at a time. If the letter is in the word, the drawer writes it in the proper space or spaces. If not, the drawer writes the used letter next to the hangman gallow and draws the head on the hangman.

 Play continues and a new body part is added to the hangman each time a wrong letter is guessed (stick body, arms, legs, dots for eyes & nose, frown).
