"You are too big," said the door. Alice saw a bottle.


She took a drink and got smaller and smaller.






Alice saw two men.

She met a caterpillar.




She got smaller and smaller.

The caterpillar turned into a butterfly and flew away.




Then Alice met a cat.

In one of the teapots there was a little mouse.






The white rabbit ran away again.

The Queen laughed too.




Alice took the mushrooms out of her pocket.
