Ways to Enrich Learning

Kindergarten is an exciting and rewarding time for young children. It is when the foundation for academic success is built. Children discover that learning is fun, which makes them want to achieve. Kindergartners need a great deal of attention, have short attention spans, and show extremes in behavior. You must create a learning environment in which your child wants to explore, learn new concepts, and practice new skills.

Your kindergartner is learning at her own pace. Keep in mind that children mature and develop skills at different rates. Some kindergartners love pencil and paper tasks, while others would rather learn through building, putting together puzzles, or doing pretend and movement activities. Through observation of your child, you will discover the ways that she learns best. Be creative and adjust each task to meet the needs of your child.

Remember that young kindergartners are not learning academic skills, but they are also learning how to participate in groups and express their feelings. Their self-esteem is increasing, and they are beginning to understand their own uniqueness. Your kindergartner needs support, guidance, participation, and undivided attention. Therefore, the activities in this book are designed for you and your child to complete together.

Some ideas for activities and materials that will enhance your child's learning experience are suggested below.

LANGUAGE ARTS

The single most important skill that a child needs is literacy. This skill is important for success in school and later in life. You can do many things to encourage literacy.

- Read to your child every day. Read every day for at least 15 minutes. This often becomes a favorite time of the day for both a child and his family. Use the recommended reading list on page 7 as a starting point for reading to your preschooler. Some things you can do before, during, and after reading with your child include the following:
 - Talk about pictures
 - Ask questions about the characters
 - Have your child guess what will happen next
 - Encourage your child to retell her favorite stories or favorite parts of a story
 - Have your child make up new endings for stories
 - Visit the library and let your child choose new books
 - Encourage "pretend reading" by allowing children to look at pictures and make up their own words.

Ways to Enrich Learning

- 2. Encourage letter recognition. Young children develop interest in reading and phonics by making observations about how adults use written language. Some activities include the following:
 - Point to letters in the environment, such as on cereal boxes, in your child's printed name, and in books and magazines
 - Help your child learn to match letters and make words
 - Play listening games by having your child identify words that begin with the same sound
 - Identify common sight words in the environment, such as *stop* and *walk*.

3. Provide language arts materials. Fill your child's environment with literacy materials. Suggested materials include:

- Magnetic letters
- Books, magazines, newspapers, and catalogs
- Paper, pencils, crayons, and paints (Encourage children to experiment with making circles, squiggles, and lines.)
- Children's music and recorded children's stories
- Computer programs that emphasize language arts and literacy skills

MATH

Many toys and puzzles provide young children with early math learning experiences. Point out all of the ways that we use numbers and other math skills in our daily lives.

- 1. Cook or garden together. Not only are these special activities for families to share together, but they also offer numerous learning experiences. Children can gain these valuable skills:
 - Measuring
 - Numbers and counting ("Stir 10 times." or "Drop three seeds in each hole.")
 - Increased observation skills
- 2. Provide mathematical materials and activities. Fill your child's environment with math materials and activities. Suggested materials include:
 - Magnifying glasse
 - Blocks and other building materials
 - Magnets and magnetic numerals
 - Scale
 - Objects that sink or float (for bath and water play)
 - Calculator and toy cash register
 - Puzzles
 - Sorting, matching, and classifying games

Getting Started

As you begin your learning adventure with your kindergartner, help your child organize some special materials. Here is a list of things your child may need:

pencils	glue	paint	scrap paper
crayons	buttons	paintbrushes	construction paper
markers	tape	paint water cup	old newspapers
colorful chalk	play dough	paint shirt	safety scissors

Have your child decorate a box for storing her supplies, and encourage her to return the supplies when she is finished using them. That way, she will always know where everything is. Nothing gets lost when "picking up" becomes a habit.

As you work through this book, you may find that there are many things you would like to save. Be prepared. Make and decorate a special memory box with your child. Take a photograph of your child and place it on the top of a box. To protect the photograph, cover it with laminate or clear shelf paper. Have your child draw and color pictures all over the box. You can use a spray finish to protect the box from wear and tear. (Be sure to cover the photograph before applying the spray to the box.)

If possible, keep an audio recorder nearby. Children love playing with audio recorders and listening to their voices. In future years, listening to recordings of your preschooler talking, reading stories, and singing songs will be a wonderful way for you and your child to remember these experiences.
