Each weekly unit provides daily assessment activities.

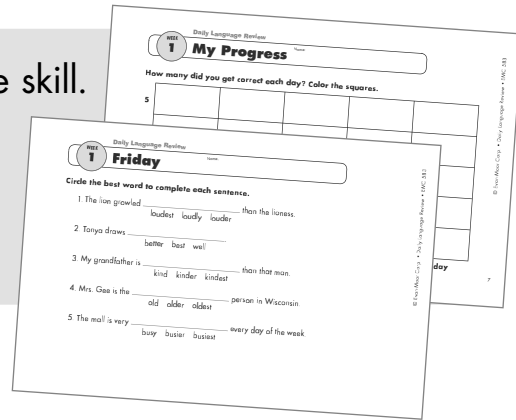
## Monday through Thursday
