

But if you add fish, meat, cheese and nuts to that, it gets better. And if you also add fruit and vegetables, then you have a balanced diet.

So, which minerals and vitamins do the different kinds of food in a balanced diet give us? Let's start with vitamins. Most people know that there's lots of Vitamin C in oranges and lemons. But did you know that it's also found in tomatoes, potatoes and peppers? Vitamin C is important because it protects us from bacteria and viruses. If people don't have enough Vitamin C, they get ill.

Vitamin A is important for growth and our development. If we don't have Vitamin A in our diet we can have problems with our eyes. Where can we find it? It's in fish, carrots, eggs and leafy green vegetables – so you should eat lots of those if you want to grow well and see well with healthy eyes. If we don't have Vitamin E our muscles get weak. It's important to eat lots of nuts, green vegetables, eggs and brown bread because these all contain lots of Vitamin E.

The last vitamin we're going to look at today is Vitamin D. Vitamin D is important for strong bones and teeth. Fish and milk contain Vitamin D, but you can also get it from sunlight, so make sure you spend plenty of time in the sunshine!
