

## Tips for Reading Together

Children learn best when reading is fun.

- Talk about the title and the pictures on the cover.
- Look through the pictures together so your child can see what the story is about.
- Read the story to your child, placing your finger under the words as you read.
- Have fun finding the hidden birds.
- Read the story again and encourage your child to join in.
- · Give lots of praise as your child reads with you.

Children enjoy reading stories again and again. This helps to build their confidence.


