# **Lesson 22** Using a Dictionary

Dictionaries are useful in many ways. Not only can you learn how to spell a word, but you can also learn the origin of the word, its part of speech, and definitions, as well as any alternate spellings. Words are listed alphabetically. The word you are looking up in a dictionary is called the entry word.

When you are looking up your entry word, go to the first letter of your word. For example, if you are looking up *proton*, go to the letter **p** first. From there, you can use guide words to help you narrow down the page. Guide words are located at the top of each page. The first guide word is the first word on the page. The second guide word is the last word on the page. If the word you are looking up is between the guide words alphabetically, then the word is on that page.

Once you have found your entry word on the page, there is a wealth of information about the word. After the entry word, you will see its pronunciation. The definition of the entry word for each part of speech will be given after the abbreviation of the part of speech. Sometimes more than one definition exists. Each definition will be listed with numbers. Sometimes, example sentences are given along with the definition to help clarify that particular definition.
