#### Замечания для родителей

СЛОВА И СЛОВОСОЧЕТАНИЯ, обозначающие какие-либо действия (глаголы) — важные слова в английском языке, без которых предложение не полное. Глагольные формы — значительная часть детского словарного запаса. Они помогут детям говорить о том, что люди делают, и о вещах, которые происходят вокруг них.

Эта книга предназначена для ознакомления ребенка с тысячью наиболее употребляемых глаголов английского языка. Мы включили как одиночные слова — глаголы, например, «call», так и глагольные обороты типа «call off».

Книга составлена с учетом трех принципов:

- необходимость расширить словарный запас глаголов у ребенка;
- показать тонкие различия между глаголами, сходными по значению, например: «see», «look», «glare», «stare»;
- необходимость ознакомить ребенка со смыслом полезных фразеологических оборотов, таких, как «get away», «get off», «get on» и «get up».

Обратите внимание, пожалуйста, на то, что глаголы не расставлены в строгом алфавитном порядке. Хотя слова сгруппированы в соответствии с их начальными буквами, внутри каждой такой группы они могут быть организованы с учетом смысла или для большей наглядности представления материала детям, чем это может допустить строгий алфавитный порядок.

Каждое новое слово сопровождается предложением (фразой), которое демонстрирует способ использования этого слова в контексте повседневной речи. Живые и забавные иллюстрации, несомненно, понравятся детям и сделают процесс обучения новым словам приятным.
