





Say "Thank you" when you are given something.








Greet each of your guests with a
Hello and Please-come-in.


Show them where to put their hats and coats.

A boy should help a girl with her coat. Hold the door open for a girl or a grown-up. Let a girl or a grown-up go first.





helping him to see that everyone has a good time. Say "Hello" to your friend and to his mother. Say "Hello" to all his friends.

Be cheerful and friendly.











When you leave, tell your friend and your friend's mother that you had a nice time. Say "Good-bye" and say "Thank you."








IF YOU ARE GOING ON A BUS OR A TRAIN, wait for your turn to get on.

Say "I'm sorry" if you bump into someone.






On a bus or a train,

get up and say "Won't you please sit down?"






In a bus or a train, or in a restaurant, don't talk loudly or shout.
